



**2. ATTENDANCE** – NSCC Regulations state that you must attend 75% of all scheduled drills. That is four of six drills per quarter. If you do not meet this minimum standard, you will be administratively warned. If you continue to fail to meet minimum attendance standards, you will be discharged from the NSCC.

**3. COURSEWORK** - All Cadets are required to complete coursework assignment (Airman, Seaman or Basic Military Requirements). A reminder to those Cadets who have not completed Recruit Training: your advancement to E-2 will be in jeopardy if you do not complete training. **TRAINING IS MANDATORY!**

This Saturday’s meal rate will cost \$11.20 because it’s a holiday meal and Sunday will be normal rate of \$6.85.
